Dear Parishioners,


For the past several years, St. Ann's has been subsidizing the seminary education of a seminarian from Kenya, Lucas Mutune. I met Lucas several years ago in Uganda while he was a brother with the Missionaries of the Poor. Lucas spent his first years with the MOP serving the poor in Kampala, Uganda, and was then sent to Kingston, Jamaica. During his time with the MOP in Jamaica, Lucas discerned that God was actually calling him to diocesan priesthood, and he became a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Kingston, Jamaica. Next Sunday, 19 February 2023, Lucas will be ordained to the priesthood at Holy Trinity Cathedral in Kingston. Please pray for him, for his family (who will not be able to attend the ordination), and for the people whom the soon-to-be Fr. Mutune will be serving!

Lent is almost upon us. This Sunday is known as Sexagesima Sunday in the ancient calendar of the Church, which is the 2nd of 3 preparatory Sundays leading up to Lent that help us prepare for the fasting and penances to come. This pre-Lent is a time for us to fix our minds and hearts more closely upon our Lord's Paschal Mystery, to contemplate His goodness and mercy, and to begin the process of conversion.

Thus, now is a good time to begin thinking about how you will use Lent to prepare yourself for Easter. Remember, Lent is not about making sacrifices and fasting simply for the sake of sacrificing and fasting. Our fasting and sacrifices should help us root out sin and become holier people. This can only happen when it is coupled with humble prayer and a love for our Lord. At the same time, it is also good to undertake almsgiving and the corporal and spiritual works of mercy alongside your fasting and sacrifices during Lent.

Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday, which will be on 22 February 2023! Keep an eye on the bulletin for information about Stations of the Cross and our Holy Hours of Reparation during Lent!







A 1st Class Feast Day are many Sundays and major solemnities like Christmas. Feria is a non-feast day and readings typically revert to the prior Sunday readings.



<u>Action Alert:</u> Contact N.C. Legislators to Support Pro-Life Legislation

North Carolina legislators are currently debating whether new pro-life legislation should protect unborn children beginning at 6 weeks (when a fetal heartbeat is detected) or at 13 weeks. According to state health data, around 85 percent of abortions in NC take place before 13 weeks - so a heartbeat law would save many more lives. Catholics are encouraged to contact their state legislators to urge them to support a heartbeat bill and, at the same time, to expand support for mothers in need. Find your N.C. legislators by visiting ncleg.gov/FindYourLegislators

- 1. Enter your **FULL** street address (including city) and press 'Enter' to search for your legislators.
- 2. Click on the name of your representatives in the N.C. House and Senate to find their email addresses and phone numbers.
- 3. Call or write a brief, personal message asking your representatives to support a heartbeat bill protecting unborn children and to expand support for pregnant and parenting mothers.

REMINDERS

Please to be mindful of our Lord's presence whenever you are in the church. Making sure to genuflect whenever you pass before the tabernacle, maintaining a prayerful silence in the church, dressing modestly and silencing cell phones are practices that we would all do well to follow—not simply out of respect for our Lord, but for the benefit of our fellow parishioners as well. Thank you!

As you come into the church, please keep in mind that we have several parishioners and visitors with walkers and canes that would like to sit in the back by the baptismal font so the walk from their cars is not too far! Make sure to lock your cars and trucks. Either keep your personal items with you in church or lock them in your trunk. *This is for your safety*.

If you are approached by panhandlers on the church campus, **please do not give them money**. Instead, direct them to the parish office for financial assistance. We have the St. Vincent de Paul Society to help those in need. Thank you!

Low gluten hosts are available at Holy Communion for those who need them. To receive a low gluten host, go to the eagle lectern after everyone else has received Holy Communion.

Be sure you are up to date on your **Protecting** God's Children information & the Virtus monthly bulletins. You need to up date your Background Check every five (5) years. All forms are online on the Diocese of Charlotte website: under Safe Environment & Volunteers.

To Parents with Infants and Small Children

One of the most beautiful blessings of our Parish is that we have so many babies and small kids! While all children are <u>most welcome</u> in the church, please keep in mind that the acoustics in our church are excellent, which means that their voices carry. If your children cry or scream during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, please be sensitive to those around you by taking your child to one of our cry rooms. The cry rooms are reserved for families with small children. Everyone else is requested to sit in the church.

To those in the Cry Rooms for Mass

Please remember that these rooms are an extension of the church itself. Therefore, please be as reverent as possible during Mass. These rooms exist to help you train your children how to attend Mass properly; thus, they should not be used as play rooms. While everyone who uses the cry rooms expects them to be a bit noisier than the church, disruptive games or toys are better left at home. Moreover, conversations in the cry rooms should be kept to a minimum during Mass. *Thank you for your consideration*.

Outdoor Speakers

We have outdoor speakers for those whose small children are too loud for the cry rooms or narthex. Please be considerate of your fellow parishioners if your children are making a lot of noise.

The general dispensation to miss Mass has been rescinded. Everyone without a serious reason to miss Mass is obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation. As has always been the case, we may legitimately miss a Sunday Mass if we are sick, if we care for the sick and infirmed, have a health condition that would be seriously compromised if we were to contract a communicable disease, or if we have good reason to think we might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness. Feel welcome to continue wearing a mask if you are more comfortable doing so. As for the Allen Center, masks are not mandated.
