


Fr. Reid's 20th Anniversary



Nationwide Pro-Life Prayer Campaign Continues

"A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world." -St. John Paul II

The USCCB is asking Catholics to continue to pray every day to St. Joseph for the protection of women and preborn children. Fervent prayer to St. Joseph, "Defender of Life," is crucial as we face many current challenges to the right to life, including:

- Upcoming decisions from the U.S. Supreme Court in cases challenging the <u>safety of the chemical abortion pill</u> (mifepristone) and deciding whether Idaho's pro-life law can be <u>overridden in certain circumstances</u> by federal law.
- Proposed federal laws and regulations that would <u>undermine respect for human life</u> and even <u>force employers to participate in</u> abortion.
