In Vitro Fertilization

As pro-life Catholics, one threating issue to life that often flies under the radar is that of In Vitro Fertilization (IVF). As medicine and technology advance, the prevalence of these lives being created outside the womb are increasing and the dignity of more persons are being cast aside. The morality of the practice of IVF is beginning to gain more attention as experimentation, artificial wombs and genetically altered or "made to order" babies are attempted at being created at increased levels.

The Church has clearly taught for decades that In Vitro Fertilization technology is clearly and unequivocally judged to be immoral (USCCB). Human beings bear the image and likeness of God. They are to be reverenced as sacred. Never are they to be used as a means to an end, not even to satisfy the deepest wishes of an infertile couple. While we continue to teach about this clear stance on the practice, participation and implementation of IVF, additional problems surrounding this issue are presenting further difficulties regarding morality.

We now have the question and weight of caring for these 1 million babies on ice (stat from National Catholic Register, Jan. 2023). What is our moral responsibility as Catholics to care for, advocate, and protect these lives? While biological parents, medical facilities and the greater "big fertility" take these issues, rights, and agendas to the courts, we must remember these are children, fully persons in a most vulnerable state, that we are dealing with.

Dignitas Personae (2008) addresses the serious moral reservations about the approach of embryo adoption as a solution, though it does not condemn it as immoral. Today, moral theologians continue to discuss and debate the morality of embryo adoption as one possible approach to the crisis of the state of these precious lives. This approach is argued to violate the loving marital act as designed and intended in procreation, the child's right to both biological parents and will put the babies at an increased risk of death during the process. Other ethicists and theologians present the likelihood that embryo adoption will remain immoral. They point out that keeping the embryos in their preserved state should be the current approach while advocating for laws to limit embryo creation and increasing our education efforts teaching the immorality of IVF as we await further moral guidance from the Church

We, the faithful, need to double our efforts to educate ourselves and all on the clear immorality of IVF and the tangled web of issues that continue to follow it in our current time. Pray for the conversion of lawmakers and doctors, and most especially for couples struggling with infertility.





OFFICE OF FAMILY LIFE <u>Life-Giving Love in an Age of Technology</u> uses a question-and-answer format to address the suffering of infertility, how Catholic couples can respond, and the problems with the use of donors, surrogates, IVF, and other reproductive technologies.

<u>In Vitro Fertilization: The Human Cost</u> outlines the risks associated with IVF, including high death rates for embryos, health risks for women and the children conceived by this procedure, and "mix-ups" and errors that harm families.
