Dear Parishioners,


The day for our Marian Consecration is almost here! After nearly 5 weeks of prayerful preparation, we are now ready to give ourselves fully to Jesus through Mary on the beautiful feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. I extend my heartfelt congratulations to all of you who have persevered in preparing for this special day. Consecrating ourselves in this fashion has tremendous spiritual benefits, which is why you are encouraged to renew your consecration each year.

If you haven't already done so, I encourage you to go to confession before making or renewing your consecration on August 15th. I also encourage you to fast from something on August 14th. It's an old and venerable Catholic practice to fast

before great feast days, which is how the seasons of Advent and Lent were started. Skipping a meal or giving up something you desire (like your morning cup of coffee or your evening glass of wine) is a good sacrifice to offer to our Lord that will make you all the more hungry for the graces our Lord desires to give you through this consecration. Fasting before a great feast is not a *quid pro quo* that we engage in with God in the hopes of getting something from Him. Rather, it is a sign of our desire to be united with our Lord in His suffering and death so that we might be united with Him in His resurrection.

Please remember that this Thursday, 15 August 2024, is a holy day of obligation, which means that all Catholics are obliged to go to Mass that day. It's also the anniversary of our parish's founding, so it is a good day for all of us here at St. Ann's Parish to come and give thanks to our Lord for the many blessings He has bestowed upon our parish family. Masses will be at 7 a.m., 12 p.m., and 7 p.m. (Latin). We will make the consecration together in the main church after each of the Masses.

Saint Maximilian Kolbe, a Polish Franciscan priest, missionary and martyr, died in the concentration camp at Auschwitz, during World War II, and is remembered as a "martyr of charity" for dying in place of another prisoner who had a wife and children. He was canonized by Pope John Paul II on October 10, 1982.

St. Maximilian, according to several biographies, was personally called by the Virgin Mary, both to his holy life and to his eventual martyrdom. As an impulsive and badly-behaved child, he prayed to her for guidance, and later described how she miraculously appeared to him holding two crowns: one was white, representing purity, the other red, for martyrdom. When he was asked to choose between these two destinies, the trouble-some child and future saint said he wanted both. Radically changed by the incident, he entered the minor seminary of the Conventual Franciscans at age 13, in 1907.




